MSc Ageing & Public Policy

Aim

Driven by a commitment to research-informed interdisciplinary education, the <u>MSc in Ageing and Public</u> <u>Policy</u> examines demographic ageing from a public policy perspective, critically assessing existing approaches and future directions to secure an effective and fair means of engaging older people in ageing societies.

Graduate Employability

The programme is aimed at preparing graduates, and/or enhancing the career prospects of existing employees, for policy, service planning and research positions focused on issues and programmes related to ageing and older people, and other areas related to social, economic and policy agendas.

Graduates with the skills taught in this programme are highly valued by public, civil-society and private organizations, such as government departments, the Health Service Executive, local authorities, research and policy consultancy groups, non-governmental organizations, and public and private care providers.







Unique Programme Internationally

- First programme of its kind in Ireland, and one of the first that is available internationally.
- Hosted at an internationally recognised research centre Irish Centre for Social Gerontology.
- Delivered in collaboration with international policy experts.
- Ageing-related policy placements with key national and international governmental, nongovernmental and civil society, and research and policy stakeholder organisations.

Why Ageing, Why Now

- With the world's older population projected to double by 2050, population ageing is recognised as a global challenge for sustainable development, and one of three major transformations facing the European Union, and the social, economic and health systems of its states.
- The Sustainable Development Goals 2030 Agenda and the European Commission Green Paper on Ageing testify to how ageing can create sustainability and equity challenges in every major policy domain social protection, health, finance, housing and environment, employment, etc.
- The COVID-19 pandemic has not only exposed weakness in ageing-related policy, but also the neglect of the diversity of needs and preferences of ageing populations.
- There is a marked gap in graduate labour force skills, and capacity, to help public agencies, civil society organisations and private companies to address these challenges and to capitalise on the opportunities within ageing societies.
- This interdisciplinary programme will address this gap and will give graduates in-depth analytical skills sets which will enhance their employability in general and in age-specific public policy organisations.

Graduate Skills

Provides topic specific and transferable skills sets including:

- In-depth knowledge of ageing related policy
- In-depth knowledge of public policy systems
- Capacity for critical thinking and theorizing
- Ability to assess and evaluate public polices
- Research, data and analytical methods
- Ability to apply data analysis techniques to real world policy challenges

• Exciting Marie-Sklodowska Curie Doctoral Researcher Positions on Ageing, Place and Home, under HOMeAGE, which is a new and exciting EU funded doctoral training network on 'Advancing Research and Training on Ageing, Place and Home' that address these research-policy deficits. HOMeAGE involves a nine-country collaboration between leading research units, major intergovernmental organisations, international civil society actors and governmental and non-governmental organisations. HOMeAGE aims to institute an interdisciplinary, intersectoral, and international programme of doctoral training and research that drives the development of new leaders in excellence for the advancement of evidence-based innovation on ageing in place. The 12 Doctoral Researchers will be hosted across the network. In addition to conducting an original research study, they will participate in a 36-month network-wide training program, public engagement activities and will collaborate with network members through short-term secondments in European and international intersectoral partner organisations.








Age Friendly South Dublin First Official Meeting
