Local Coordinator Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme

The recruitment campaign for Healthy Age Friendly Homes Local Co-Ordinator's is now open. Through the Public Appointments Service applications are being sought from suitably qualified persons who wish to be considered for inclusion on panels for the position of Local Coordinator for the Healthy Age Friendly Homes (HAFH) Programme

The HAFH Programme is an initiative, funded by Sláintecare, that aims to enable older people to continue living in their homes or in a home more suited to their needs, live with a sense of independence and autonomy, be and feel part of their community, and support the avoidance of early or premature admission to long term residential care.



The HAFH Programme will be rolled out nationally across all local authority areas as part of Phase 2 of the programme and a total of 44 Local Coordinator positions will be in place across 6 Regions. The Local Coordinators will be employed by Meath County Council but will be based with a host local authority in their region.

Francis Kane, local coordinator of the Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme across Galway city and county recently visited the Aran Islands of Inis Meáin and Inis Oírr to promote the Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme as part of the Healthy Islands 2023 initiative led by Healthy County Galway and Galway Rural Development. This award winning and unique multi agency partnership promotes health and well-being throughout the islands of county Galway. Among the agencies providing information and free health checks were Croi Heart and Stroke Charity, Galway Sports Partnership, Mental Health Ireland, Alzheimer Society, Chime, Jigsaw, Parkrun, Gardaí, Galway PPN, along with Healthy County Galway and Galway Rural Development.











Francis was available to inform islanders about the Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme and answer any questions they had for him about services and supports available. Inis Meáin has a year-round population of about 200, making it the smallest of the Aran Islands in terms of population, while Inis Oírr has a year-round population of about 260, although the numbers on both islands increase in the summer months with tourists visiting. Great interest was shown in the Healthy Homes Programme and thanks to both Healthy County Galway and Galway Rural Development for organising the Healthy Islands initiative.

	Niamh Davenport, Head of Financial Crime at the BPFI, said, "Text message scams known as smishing <i>are targeting consumers in their everyday lives</i> . It is important to be aware of the risks posed by these scams and how to identify them. You will never receive a text from your bank directly seeking you confirm or verify your personal or financial details. If you are uncertain as to whether a text or email is genuine, ring your bank separately using the number on the back of your card,

genuine, ring your bank separately using the number on the back of your card, don't use contact details from the text or email. If you think you may have fallen victim to text or email scam, contact your bank immediately."




