I sat in on a meeting and was delighted to hear the number of lovely activities and trips were planned for the next few months. There was such a great variety of activities from Armchair Yoga, Theatre trips, Exhibitions, and day trips. The active retirees of Cashel have an interesting few months ahead.

I outlined for the group the ethos of the Healthy Homes Project; to help participants stay in their own homes, comfortable and safe for as long as possible. I summarised the different elements and how the programme works. I meet with participants in their own homes, and we have an informal chat to discuss the different areas of their lives such as housing, health and how they connect in their communities.

We talk about technology and how it could be of use if there is an interest. The participant has complete autonomy, and the process is driven by them. There is no pressure to consider anything that is of no interest or help to the participant.

Irish Heart Foundation - Before Damage is Done Campaign

Everyone has a blood pressure. Your blood pressure is a measure of the force your heart uses to pump blood around the body.



How is blood pressure measured?

Two numbers measure the level of your blood pressure.

Systolic pressure is the pressure when the heart muscle beats to pump blood to the rest of your body – this is the top number.

Diastolic pressure is the pressure when your heart relaxes between beats – this is the bottom number.

What is a normal level of blood pressure?

The normal level of blood pressure is usually about 120 (systolic) over 80 (diastolic).

High blood pressure is 140 over 90 or higher (or 140 over 80 if you have diabetes).

Why is blood pressure important?

Lower blood pressure when you stand up or bend over (known as postural hypotension) may make you feel faint or dizzy. If this happens, tell your doctor and have your blood pressure taken when you are standing up.

High blood pressure carries risks for a number of serious conditions. The higher your blood pressure, the greater your risk of heart attack or stroke, heart failure, kidney failure, dementia and some forms of blindness.

When and how to check blood pressure

The only way to look after – and know if you have – high blood pressure is to have it measured.

Try to get your blood pressure checked regularly and ask what your reading is. If you are over 30, it's best to have your blood pressure checked once every 5 years. If your blood pressure is borderline high (around 140 over 90), you'll need to get it checked more often by a doctor or nurse.

Many pharmacies are now offering blood pressure checks and some do 24-hour blood pressure monitoring. Sometimes your doctor will suggest you buy a reliable blood pressure monitor and measure your blood pressure regularly at home.


The Assisted Decision-making Capacity Act May 2023



Safeguarding Ireland's current Public Awareness campaign is about understanding and using the new Assisted Decision-making (Capacity) Act, a progressive law which supports peoples' rights which will prevent and reduce adult abuse.

The new law, which came in effect in April 2023, is about rights, and taking every possible step to assist people to continue making their own decisions about their health, finances, housing, work or personal welfare – even if there are challenges in doing so.

The Act is of particular importance for people who have challenges with decisionmaking such as those living with frailty, dementia, an intellectual disability, an acquired brain injury, or mental illness. But it may be important to all of us at certain times in our lives.



A new State Agency called Decision Support Service (DSS) has been established and is responsible for promoting public awareness, to register the new decision support arrangements, to provide oversight and to resolve issues which arise. 
