Clúid launch their Annual Report 2022 - Connecting Communities





In what has been a busy year, filled with many successes and challenges, we delivered our 10,000th home and supported over 26,800 residents across Ireland. This is a major milestone for all at Clúid. We delivered 1,251 new homes into management, supporting 4,054 residents to settle into their new homes and communities. Our dedicated team continues to work in collaboration with our colleagues in local and national government, state bodies, finance, industry, and community partners to contribute to delivering the targets set out in Housing for All.

Our Resident Advisory Groups are more active than ever, sharing their voice and shaping the policies and processes that impact on their lives. Our commitment to Diversity, Equity, Belonging, and Inclusion (DEBI) continues. Clúid offers training initiatives and promotes regular events, for both staff and residents, contributing to an inclusive Ireland.

Sustainable development remains a core objective. Our retrofit programme is well underway with a total of 1,417 homes retrofitted to a minimum B-rated BER. Our Greening Strategy continues to deliver results. We are currently working on several exciting developments. These include partnering with EnergyCloud to redirect excess renewable energy to tackle energy poverty and, through our Landscape Designer, working to improve local biodiversity in neighbourhoods across Ireland.

Catch up on presentations from the International Symposium on Integrated Health and Care System for Older People: China Insights

In China, there were 280 million people aged 60 and above at the end of 2022, accounting for 19.8 percent of the entire population. The figure is expected to exceed 300 million by 2025, and 400 million by around 2035. The incidence of chronic disease and disability for the elderly is astonishingly high. Among the 267 million people aged 60 and over in 2021, there were about 190 million individuals who have at least one chronic disease and 40 million living with disability.







In response to the complex needs and drawing from international experiences, China has adopted active and healthy ageing and integrating health and care strategies as policy priorities in coping with population ageing in the past decade. Progress has been made while challenges remain.


In this first "China Insights" symposium jointly sponsored by Peking Union Medical College (PUMC) of China and International Foundation for Integrated Care (IFIC), over 1000 delegates joined the session to learn from Chinese and international experts on policy progress and practice models of care integration in China as well as global experiences and lessons learned.

Topics covered in the symposium included:

- Global evolving trends and lessons learned of health and care integration.
- China's Policy evolvement and progress made in the health and care integration
- WHO ICOPE demonstration in China
- Diverse models of integrated care in China driven by municipal government, healthcare system consortium and long-term extended care facility.
- China's long-term care insurance in the promotion of care integration
- Digital and technological innovations in the advancement of care integration in China.

Huge turnout at Clare's 'Health & Wellbeing' Age Expo on Friday 30th June 2023

Clare's Older People's Council supported by Clare County Council's Age Friendly Clare and Healthy Clare programmes hosted a very successful Health and Wellbeing Age Expo at Treacy's West County Ennis on 30th June 2023.













Over 500 people turned out to the Age Expo which showcased the supports and services available in County Clare that are of interest and use to older people. The Mid-West Community Healthcare - Integrated Care Programme Older Persons, Active Ennis, Clare Sports Partnership, Clare Libraries, Local Link, Alzheimer's Society of Ireland and Slainte an Chlair were just some examples of those displaying at the event.

Guest speakers discussed the new 'Healthy Age Friendly Homes' initiative and 'Preparing for a Healthy Retirement'. Attendees also had an opportunity to participate in a singing taster session, Active Ageing classes and attend a cookery demonstration.
