Energy Poverty Day



The Energy Poverty Stakeholder Forum took place in Dublin earlier this month. This forum focused on the Energy Poverty Action Plan which set out the range of measures that were implemented across Government during winter 2022/23, as well as longer term measures, to ensure that those least able to afford increased energy costs are supported and protected to adequately heat and power their homes.

The event focused primarily on the four key areas of the Action Plan: Meeting the Cost of Energy, Energy Efficiency, Research and Communications. Workshops based on these areas was held during the event. Eimear McCormack Healthy Age Friendly Homes Regional Manager attended the event and participated in the workshops. Outcomes from the day will directly inform Government policy and revisions to a future Energy Poverty Action Plan.



Health Regions Implementation Plan published

The health service is being reorganised into six HSE Health Regions

Health Regions will allow us to:

- deliver more integrated care closer to patients' homes by bringing hospital and community services together
- plan and deliver services around the needs of local populations
- improve governance and accountability at all levels
- strengthen local decision-making
- provide consistent quality of care across the country







Health Regions will help shape the future of health and social care in this country. They will allow us to deliver safer, better care that is planned and funded in line with local and regional health needs.

The Implementation Plan sets out a high-level programme of work to establish Health Regions from February 2024. It includes key actions and timelines throughout 2023 and into 2024.

Mullingar brothers who wrote 'Grace' honoured in their hometown



Two brothers who wrote the famous Irish song 'Grace' have been honoured in their hometown of Mullingar, Co Westmeath. Sean and Frank O'Meara from St Bridget's Terrace received the Gradam Na hÉigse award.



Mullingar Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann honoured the brothers with the Gradam Na hÉigse award in recognition of their long-time commitment to Irish culture and heritage. The brothers wrote the song in 1985 about the artist Grace Gifford who married Joseph Mary Plunkett in the chapel at Kilmainham

Gaol just hours before he was executed in 1916. Grace has been recorded by numerous Irish and international artists and is now one of the most popular ever Irish songs.
