Now in its fourteenth year, the awards recognise the contributions made by groups or individuals who campaign, educate and are committed to improving road safety in their community.

- Education Pre-primary, Primary, Secondary, Special, Third Level/Further and Community Education

The winners in each of these categories will be in with a chance of becoming the winner of the Gertie Shields Supreme Award for 2023. The award is dedicated to Gertie Shields, an inspirational road safety activist who sadly passed away in 2015 and who won the Supreme Award in 2013. The brilliant mystery writer Raymond Chandler spent his childhood in three different countries—-America, Ireland, and England, and each place had a distinct influence on his writing and personality.

'The Big Sleep', his first novel, was published in 1939, elevating the hardboiled detective story to classic crime literature. Chandler went on to write numerous stories and seven novels, many filmed and now regarded as classics of the Film Noir genre.


































Tipperary Older Peoples Council Updates
