Significant progress has been made to date, with 53 of the 86 recommendations now considered complete or mainstreamed into normal operations. A range of further initiatives and workstreams are ongoing to progress the remaining recommendations.

	taken in the nursing home or facility where they reside instead of having to go to the hospital.
	The service is currently running in Dublin, Wicklow, Meath, Kildare, Louth, Cork,
	Limerick, Clare and North Tipperary and since August is offered in South Tipperary, Carlow, Kilkenny, Waterford and Wexford. It will be available nationwide in 2024 with Galway and the North West next in line to benefit from the service.

Leitrim County Council, as part of their delivery of the Healthy Leitrim Programme and in conjunction with An Garda Síochána Community Engagement & Crime Prevention Units hosted a "Community Information Fair" on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> in The Landmark Hotel, Carrick-on-Shannon. The event was supported by Leitrim Age Friendly, Leitrim PPN, and the Leitrim Development Company.

Scores of over 55s gathered at this Age Friendly event for a wonderful opportunity to learn and connect to the resources and supports available in Leitrim. The event provided older persons with a chance to meet and talk to representatives from Leitrim County Council and An Garda Siochana, and to engage with 40 information stands consisting of local health, educational, social, technology and security services. Over 100 people availed of free Health Screening (blood pressure and blood glucose), Leitrim Sports Partnership provided exercise workshops, plus, everyone that attended received a goodie bag worth over €30!

In welcoming this event, Leitrim County Council Cathaoirleach Justin Warnock believes "Collaboration among organizations is fundamental to promoting agefriendly environments in Leitrim. As people are living longer and healthier lives, we need to ensure our county is a great place to grow old in too. This is an excellent occasion for the people of Leitrim to forge positive links with organisations to help people live well in their community".

The Minister visited Leitrim Calling in Drumshanbo. Leitrim Calling, as a confidential telephone call service, seeks to support older people living alone in isolated areas. It also reaches out to persons feeling lonely or isolated at any age, persons feeling vulnerable or challenged either in the short term or longer. It provides this service in a professional, caring and respectful manner. The Service is committed to the care and wellbeing of older, vulnerable, and lonely persons and offers a service to approximately 135 users and manages an average of 1600 telephone calls per month.

Social Inclusion Week is an annual event and has become an important opportunity to promote the work of local organisations active throughout the county. Leitrim County Council supports many Age Friendly initiatives that provide individuals and communities affected by issues which can lead to social exclusion, such as isolation, disability, and mental health to name just a few.
