

### 17th Korean Gerontological Society Seoul Symposium



The 17th Seoul International Symposium on Gerontology, jointly hosted by the Korean Society of Gerontology and the Seoul Metropolitan Government. The theme of this international academic symposium is "Digital Transformation and Agefriendly Cities".

At this international academic symposium, discussions will be held to further upgrade Seoul's membership as an age-friendly city, 10 years after it joined in 2013. We would like to update the WHO's guide on age-friendly cities and draw implications from the experiences of cities that are successfully implementing age-friendly city programs.










An Garda Síochána Property App has been launched




# Co.Louth win the IPB Pride of Place Award under the Age Friendly category

On Monday 20th November 2023 Age Friendly were delighted to attend the Dementia Conference hosted by Family Carers Ireland at the Strand Hotel.

The well-attended event was a day full of very useful information and workshops aimed at family carers who are caring for a loved one with dementia.

Information and advice was provided on the day by a number of service

providers including Family Carers Ireland, Alzheimers Society, TASK Community Care, Sage Advocacy, The Decision Support Service, Limerick Memory Technology Room, ALONE and Limerick Libraries.

The workshops included a presentation and Q&A by the Decision Support Service on The Assisted Decision-Making Capacity Act.



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There was also an interactive dance session (Some Dance to Remember) by Carmel McKenna and Sean Donal O'Shea.



Some of the other workshops included Leaning into Love: Grief for the Dementia Caregiver by Jennifer Stritch, Managing Behaviours that Challenge by Fiona Staunton, 5 Ways to Wellbeing for Family Carers by Anna De Siun and Down Syndrome and Dementia: A Family Carers Experience by David Kieran.


