Updates from HSE Services



Cold weather advice

See below tips on how to keep well over the coming weeks and information on what health services are available to you:

- Cold weather sees significant increase in ED attendances for slips, trips, and falls. HSE Injury Units treat injuries that are not life-threatening such as broken bones, sprains, dislocations and minor burns. Injury units can help with many of the injuries people go to the Emergency Department for. <u>Find information about</u> your nearest injury unit here.
- Consider all options when you need care, such as your GP, pharmacy, GP out-ofhours service or injury unit. Make an appointment with your GP if you feel unwell or talk to your pharmacist for advice on common minor illnesses.
- For colds and mild viruses, make sure you have what you need at home to take care of these such as a well-stocked medicine cabinet. If you are unwell, stay at home until 48 hours after your major symptoms have resolved and avoid people who are more vulnerable.
- It is still not too late to get vaccinated. COVID-19 and flu vaccines are available from your GP or pharmacy for older people, children aged 2-17, healthcare workers, people who are pregnant and those at higher risk. <u>Find a pharmacy to book an appointment</u>.
- For life-threatening emergencies, call an ambulance (112 or 999) or visit your nearest Emergency Department.





Monaghan Older People's Council Launches Drive for New Members

The Older People's Council continues to campaign on a number of issues which affect older people living in Monaghan which includes how the move towards technology is having a negative impact on older people's lives, the difficulties that those being left behind face with the move towards a cashless society and a review of the public transport services in Monaghan.

Seamus McDermott, Chair of Monaghan Older People's Council, believes that "Monaghan Older People's Council is making a real difference in the county. It is vital that older people have a role in local decision making and I would encourage new members to join and have their say. 


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Louth Older People's Council Meet in Ardee



Members of Louth's Older People's Council (OPC) held their final meeting of 2023 in the Ardee Civic Offices on 6th December 2023. OPC members met with local community garda Austin Kelly who gave them an overview of community policing in Ardee & Mid Louth and explained about the new Garda structures in Co Louth.

Ger Walsh & Aine McNamee from the HSE gave the members a presentation on the Living Well Programme and advised this is a peer to peer support training programme for those living with long term health conditions. A number of Living Well programmes will be rolled out across Co Louth in 2024.

Louth Age Friendly Christmas Bag Project

The Louth OPC as part of the Age Friendly Programme supported the preparation of over 300 Christmas Bags for distribution to older and vulnerable people across Co Louth. Christmas Bags were filled with treats, sweets and goodies and were distributed to older and vulnerable people living in Co Louth. Community partners such as Meals on Wheels, An Garda Síochána, Louth Volunteer Centre, Alone, DDS4OP and others helped to distribute the bags.

Louth OPC getting ready to deliver a suite of ageism initiatives in 2024 and beyond to challenge negative stereotypes around ageing and ageism.

The challenges faced by older people were highlighted in the EU_SHAFE Project Report on Ageism, which was launched by Louth County Council at the Louth OPC meeting in July 2023. The Ageism Report is the result of a survey on ageing and ageism published by Louth EU_SHAFE (Smart Healthy Age Friendly Environments) in December 2022.



The survey was sampled by the Living Lab, Netwell Casala Advanced Research Centre, Dundalk Institute of Technology. There were over 700 responses to the survey, which focused on self-perceptions of ageing, society's attitude to ageing and structural attitudes to ageing. The report found that while "the majority of people do not see themselves as old when asked directly, they also appear to have internalised the negative narrative that older people lack capacity and that ageing is unattractive."











The findings also highlighted that "very high percentage of people are subject to jokes, media imagery and assumptions about their capacity on an almost daily basis." Other results highlighted the stereotype that older people are "unable" to use technology with almost one third of under 34s agreeing. But more than two thirds of over 55s disagreed. The descriptions used to depict older people were also included in the survey, with 47% choosing "Older Person". The least favourite choices were Pensioner, Elderly and OAP.

The report looked at ageing and ageism across services and concludes that there is still a lot of work to be done in this area. Following on from the launch of the report the Louth OPC & Alliance prepared a joint submission to the Louth LECP. This joint submission has now been included as an objective and an action in new Louth LECP

Louth Local Economic & Community Plan (LECP)

- Objective 5.4 Continue to support an Age Friendly society for all.
- Action 5.4.2 Support the Age Friendly Programme to deliver a suite of ageism awareness initiatives.
- Louth OPC members will be busy delivering on this action in 2024 and over the lifetime of the new Louth LECP.

It is anticipated the initiatives will raise awareness around the whole concept of ageism, challenge the negative stereotypes around ageing and ageism particularly in relation to ageist language and attitudes in society and reframe the conversation around positive ageing in Co Louth.

Louth OPC hosting Meath OPC

Louth OPC are looking forward to hosting Meath OPC at the Netwell CASALA Centre, DKIT on 24^{th} January 2024

The purpose of the visit is for both OPC's to be shown around The Netwell CASALA Centre, located on the DKIT campus.

The Netwell CASALA Centre is a research centre and Living Lab where staff, students and researchers design, develop, test and trial digital health and wellbeing solutions with and for older people, and those who care for and about them, to empower and support better and longer living in the community.

Suzanne Smyth Centre Director will host both OPC's and give them a tour of the centre.

ICPOP Co Ordinator's from Louth & Meath will also attend and present to both OPC's about their respective ICPOP Programmes in each county.

The visit will also be an opportunity for both OPC's to get to know each other and explore the possibility of future collaborations including potential ageism awareness projects.

It is hoped the Louth OPC will travel to visit their colleagues in Co Meath later in the year.
