
History


Ballyhaise House was built for the Newburghs, a local landowning family, in the 1730s. It is said to contain the earliest surviving oval room in Ireland and Britain. The building was traditionally credited to Richard Cassels, a German architect living in Dublin. It is more recently thought that Ballyhaise house is actually by the architect of the Irish Houses of Parliament in Dublin, Sir Edward Lovett Pearce.

2 // Being only 15 minuets drive from Cavan,
Ballyhaise could further become a dormitory
town to Cavan Town in the future which could
generate road traffic and would not contribute to
enhancing the local community.

// The quarry being for sale presents a threat to the local people and the environment as excavation could increase and could bring disruption to residents and businesses on the main road through traffic, noise and dust.

// Abandoned buildings suggest a weak property market.
