Keep heavy items like soil, rubble, DIY or garden waste out of your residual bin – all these items are accepted at your local civic amenity site so check your local authority website for opening hours & costs of using these centres.

**HAZARDOUS WASTE** 



Never put hazardous waste in your bin. Electrical items, paints & oils should also all be taken to your civic amenity site for recycling or disposal. Electrical items are accepted free of charge at this facility.
