Global walking summit, Walk21, shares programme and speaker line-up for this year's conference 19-23 September 2022 in Dublin, Ireland

Walk21, **the** global walking summit previously held in Rotterdam, Hong Kong and Seoul, will take place this September 19-23 in Dublin, Ireland. The conference will bring together around 500 delegates and an incredible speaker line-up of over 60 experts including practitioners, academics, planners, politicians and citizens to celebrate the importance of walking and to re-imagine a world that is more liveable and sustainable.



Over five days, the packed programme will address this year's theme, *The Decade to Change*, and will explore how supporting and encouraging walking can help deliver Sustainable Development Goal commitments by 2030. The programme incorporates plenary sessions and parallel workshops, led by global experts on high profile subjects including:

- Walking infrastructure/the built environment and accessibility
- Case studies from around the world
- Links between walking and wellbeing/mental health
- Relationships between transport providers and walking

Public Consultation

What do you think are the challenges facing Irish mental health services?

We are inviting all stakeholders to help us develop our strategic plan for the next five years. The strategy, our seventh, will cover the period 2023-2028. As part of this process, it is critically important that we listen a broad range of voices who have some experience of engaging with the MHC.

We are anxious to ensure that our strategic intent and direction is both evidence-based and informed. "This will be a busy period where we will launch the Decision Support Service and expand regulation of the MHC into mental health community services," said the Chief Executive of the Mental Health Commission, John Farrelly. "We wish to consult with all our key internal and external stakeholders to inform and identify strategic priorities that will lead our work over the next period. All inputs will help us to develop a deeper understanding of how the Mental Health Commission and the Decision Support Service is perceived, and what we need to focus on and aim to achieve over the next five years." Advanced Digital Access Participation Project

New Digital Access for Key Heritage Sites

Wexford County Council's Access Section are delighted to inform of the launch of the 'Advanced Digital Access Participation Project' (ADAPP), an exciting pilot project which provides digital access to five key heritage sites across County Wexford.

Background

This project, through the creation of virtual tours and QR codes, ensures that five different heritage sites can be digitally accessed and visited by persons of all ages and abilities at any time, from the comfort of their own home. Physical access to heritage sites can be difficult given their very nature, environmental restrictions and the general topography of the site. However, this project now offers a solution by providing alternative access through digital means, such as your computer, mobile phone or tablet. QR codes, which can be scanned using your mobile device, will also be located on signage at each site so that anyone physically visiting the site can get instant access to the virtual tour, and explore the areas that are not physically accessible or open to the public.

Virtual tours

Virtual tours are an online, interactive version of a physical tour of a site. Each virtual tour provides a full digital walkthrough of the heritage site, offering access to all areas of the site with information on the history and features of the site.

The tour includes tagged points of interest and narration by our very own Heritage Officer, providing interesting historical background and context to the site.

Narration is subtitled and communicated by an on-screen Irish Sign Language interpreter, offering greater accessibility for all to explore and learn about the history of the site.

Friends of the Elderly is an award-winning charity with Nationwide services established now in Ireland for over 40 years. We are based at 25 Bolton Street, Dublin 1 and we offer a home visitation service and a friendly call service to people aged 60+, we also offer food hampers and a birthday celebration program.
