This guide, which is attached, is intended to clearly convey to customers in need of additional support that support is available from the 5 banks when they are moving their bank account. The 5 banks (AIB, Bank of Ireland, KBC, Permanent TSB and Ulster Bank) have undertaken to deliver on the commitments to customers set out in the Guide and please be assured that Ulster Bank wants to ensure that we do so on a consistent basis.

North Region - Creative Ireland Project - St Brigid Traditions



















Age Friendly Ireland in partnership with Creative Ireland, Age & Opportunity, Sligo Age Friendly, Donegal Age Friendly, Mayo Age Friendly, Cavan Age Friendly, Monaghan Age Friendly and Leitrim Age Friendly Programs kicked off their Creativity workshops exploring some of the traditions associated with St Brigid. The groups explored the history and stories into this special celtic women and discussed wither the new long weekend bank holiday should be recognised and celebrated as the female version of St Patricks day or should the St Brigid be recognised as just "Brigid" and even the name "Biddy" came up.







In the first workshop they designed their own St Brigid crosses using natural materials (Straw, Flowers and wool) each creating their own design and putting their own mark on the cross. The afternoons workshop had the group again explore Brigid but this time through creative writing and poetry, everybody wrote their own poem and read it individually to the wider group.



On Friday the 30th of October older people from all 6 Counties are invited to The National Museum of Ireland, Country Life in Turlough Park House, Gortnafolla, Castlebar, Co. Mayo to showcase their beautiful crafted crosses and share their poems with other groups, they will then get to offer their prayers or written wishes to St Brigid.




