The National Age Friendly Achievement Awards 2022

27 Projects Shortlisted for National Age Friendly Recognition Awards Clare County Council Host Awards Ceremony in Dromoland Castle



Councillor Tony O'Brien, Cathaoirleach of Clare County Council welcomed over two hundred and 50 people from across Ireland to the wonderful Dromoland Castle for this year's National Age Friendly Recognition and Achievement Awards ceremony on Thursday, 27th October at 6.30 pm.

The Age Friendly Recognition and Achievement Awards showcase age friendly initiatives from around the country that are contributing to making Ireland a great place in which to grow old. The event was presented by Age Friendly Ireland, a shared service function of Local Government in Meath County Council and was hosted and sponsored by Clare County Council. Master of Ceremonies for the evening was the wonderful Marty Morrissey, Irish sports commentator and television presenter with RTÉ.









This is the sixth annual awards ceremony for Age Friendly Ireland since 2014. Clare County Council expressed an interest to host the awards with Age Friendly Ireland in 2020 however due to the pandemic in early 2020 and like many other events, our awards ceremony had to be postponed.



In 2022 in consultation with our Older People's Councils we collectively agreed that there was a huge appetite to bring back the awards, given the dreadful events of the previous two and a half years. Clare has been an Age Friendly County since 2013 and have made significant progress in embedding an age









friendly approach to all of their work, as such we were delighted to have the Awards Ceremony hosted in the beautiful County Clare.



This year eight categories of awards, aligning to the themes of the World Health Organisation Age Friendly Cities and Communities, were presented to age friendly projects in recognition for their innovative and creative approach to making Ireland a great place in which to grow old.

This week we would like to introduce you to Tracey Thompson who is the Healthy Age Friendly Homes Coordinator for Tipperary.



The conference will be composed of a diversity of representatives from all age groups in industry, technology, and representatives from a diversity of workplaces, policy and academia. This is part of a DCU research project called POWER AGING, which is funded by the Irish Research Council (IRC) under the New Foundations programme 2022.

POWER AGING builds on a DCU report (2020) on ageism and bullying, which discovered that informed strategies, policy and practice need to be developed to address ageism and bullying in workplaces (Corrigan and Morgan, 2020).

This project is a partnership approach between the Anti Bullying Centre (DCU) and the N.G.O. Age and Opportunity. It will provide strategies to promote economic, social, cultural, education and training benefits for older people in Ireland. This is in particular to address issues related to behaviours of both the mind and environment, which currently can impact younger and older workers either in a negative or positive way. The overall aim is to facilitate change to promote policy and practice, which supports positive ageing in our world today.

SELF-AGEISM REPORT LAUNCHED

Mary Butler, Minister for Mental Health and Older People welcomes report.



Waterford Older People's Council have now released their 'Combatting Self-Ageism: Advocacy through the Arts' report which highlights the scale of ageist and self-ageist attitudes in Ireland today and the impact it has on people's health and wellbeing. Studies have shown that self-ageism strongly undermines older adults' physical, emotional and mental health, and therefore requires greater recognition as being a serious social and health threat to the people of Ireland. The Report which was funded by the Community Foundation of Ireland and produced by Rachel Lartey, was welcomed by Minister Butler at the launch held in the Waterford Medieval Museum.




Kilkenny Older People's Council Celebrates


