The initiative sheds light on the obstructions and hazards caused by improper parking in Limerick city and county, emphasising the impact on fellow road and footpath users.

The entire route was just under 1km and participants looked at the built environment including footpaths, roadways, lighting, signage








The comments, observations and recommendations from the participants have been collated into a report and will be presented as a submission to the Joint Drogheda Local Area Plan which is on public display at present.
