Introduction

The Cavan Age Friendly Alliance was formally established in 2012 and consists of relevant stakeholders in the development of the older persons sector in the county and the promotion of a positive approach to ageing. Through cooperation and consultation with older people in Cavan, the Alliance developed and is implementing the Cavan Age Friendly Strategy, 2022 to 2024. This strategy sets out the vision and the aims as regards making Cavan an age friendly county.

Cavan Older Persons Council Cavan Older People's Council was set up in 2013 as a way of bringing together all the older people's groups in County Cavan and representing the views of older people. It works closely with local agencies and the voluntary sector to deliver the county's Age Friendly Strategy.

The Council is a network of about older people's and social services groups and individuals. The full network meets once a year at its AGM (Annual General Meeting) and on other occasions for consultations and events.

The Council has an Executive Committee which is elected from its members. If you are interested in joining the Cavan Older People's Council, you need to fill in a registration form. Once you become a member, you will be included on the mailing list for any newsletters, information about events etc. Members can also put themselves forward for election to the Executive Committee of the Older People's Council at their annual AGM. ■ Cavan Citizens Information Service

The service is funded & supported by the Citizens Information Board. The service is free, confidential, impartial and independent. Information, Advice and Advocacy supports are provided in a range of areas such as social welfare, employment, housing, health, immigration and many more areas.

Income supports for older people*

A range of payments are made to older people by the Department of Social Protection (DSP) and the Health Service Executive (HSE). If you are unsure whether or not you would qualify for a payment, you should apply anyway.

Generally, payments are made up of a personal payment for yourself and extra amounts for your dependent spouse, civil partner or cohabitant and any dependent children. A cohabitant is a person living in an intimate and committed relationship with a person of the same or opposite sex who is not that person's spouse, civil partner, or a close relative.

You should apply to the Department of Social Protection for your pension at least **3 months in advance**.

Social insurance payments

You need enough PRSI contributions to qualify for these payments. Apply to the Department of Social Protection.

State Pension (Contributory)

The State Pension (Contributory) is payable from the age of 66. You are allowed to have income from any other source while you receive this pension, but both the income and the pension are taxable.

There are a number of pro-rata State Pensions (Contributory) which are paid at a lower rate. These were introduced to deal with issues that arose as a result of people paying different types of social insurance contributions or not paying contributions for various reasons.

Under the National Pensions Framework, a number of other changes are planned to the qualifying conditions for the State Pension (Contributory). These changes do not affect the State Pension (Non-Contributory).

Widow's, Widower's or Surviving Civil Partner's Contributory Pension

You may be eligible for Widow's, Widower's or Surviving Civil Partner's Contributory Pension if you are widowed or a surviving civil partner, have not remarried or entered into a new civil partnership, and are not cohabiting. You can transfer to the State Pension (Contributory) at the age of 66.

Means-tested payments

Any means you may have, such as weekly income or savings, are taken into account for these payments, but not your own home. You must also satisfy the habitual residence condition. Apply to the Department of Social Protection.

State Pension (Non-Contributory)

The State Pension (Non-Contributory) is a payment for people aged 66 or over who do not qualify for a State Pension (Contributory).

Working in retirement

If you are getting a means-tested payment, working or being self-employed affects the amount of that payment. You can have up to €200 earnings from insurable employment without affecting your State Pension (Non-Contributory).

Widow's, Widower's or Surviving Civil Partner's Non-Contributory Pension

If you are a widowed person or a surviving civil partner who is not entitled to a Widow's,

Widower's or Surviving Civil Partner's Contributory Pension, has not remarried or entered into a new civil partnership, has no dependent children and is not cohabiting, you may be eligible for a Widow's, Widower's or Surviving Civil Partner's Non Contributory Pension. This is a means-tested payment. At age 66 you transfer to the State Pension (Non-Contributory).

Private pensions*

Occupational and personal pensions

Occupational pensions are organised by employers to provide pensions to employees on retirement or to surviving dependants on the death of an employee. Personal pensions or Personal Retirement Savings Accounts (PRSAs) are organised individually by self-employed people or employed people who do not have an occupational pension scheme.

You need to deal directly with the pension provider to find out exactly what benefits your pension gives you. The Pensions Authority is the regulatory body for occupational pensions and PRSAs. If you have a complaint, the Authority will

advise you about your rights. The Pensions Ombudsman investigates and decides on complaints relating to occupational pensions and PRSAs. Generally, you may have income from other sources, for example, from work, if you are receiving a pension. There are some restrictions on people getting both a pension and employment income from the public sector – you should check with the pension provider.

Other social welfare payments*

Increase for Living Alone

The Increase for Living Alone is a supplementary payment for people on social welfare pensions who are living alone. It is also available to people under the age of 66 who get certain other payments from the Department of Social Protection.

Aged 80 increase

If you are getting a social welfare pension, you automatically get an increase in your pension when you reach 80 years of age.

Household Benefits Package

The Household Benefits Package includes the Electricity or Natural Gas Allowance and a Free TV Licence. If you are aged 70 or over, you qualify regardless of your income or who lives with you. The scheme may also be available to people aged 66 and over who get certain social welfare payments or whose income is below certain limits.

Free travel

If you are over the age of 66 or getting a carers' or certain other social welfare payments, you can get a Free Travel Pass, entitling you to free travel at any time on bus, road, rail and DART services operated by Bus Átha Cliath, Bus Éireann, Iarnród Éireann, LUAS services, the Aran Islands ferry service and on certain private services which have opted into the scheme.

You can also use your Free Travel Pass on any of the 34 schemes under the Rural Transport Initiative. People who are entitled to free travel are also entitled to have their spouse/partner travel free with them or may be entitled to a Companion Pass on medical grounds. The Free Travel Scheme also covers public transport services in Northern Ireland for people over 66 years of age who have a Senior Smart Pass Card.

National Fuel Scheme

The National Fuel Scheme is a means-tested payment to help people who cannot afford their own heating costs. You may qualify if you get certain payments from the Department of Social Protection or the EU equivalent.

Telephone Support Allowance

The Telephone Support Allowance is a supplementary payment for people on certain social welfare payments who are also getting both the Living Alone Increase and the Fuel Allowance.

Carers

If you are providing full-time care to someone who is ill or incapacitated, you may qualify for a carer's payment. The main payments are Carer's Allowance (Means Assessed) and Carer's Benefit (PRSI based). If you are caring for two or more people, your rate of Carer's Allowance is increased by 50% (maximum) each week. If you are getting another social welfare payment, you may get half-rate Carer's Allowance. The Carer's Support Grant is automatically paid to people getting Carer's payments in June each year.

Additional Needs Payment

An Additional Needs Payment is a payment available to you if you have expenses that you cannot pay from your weekly income. You may get this payment even if

you are not getting a social welfare payment. It also may be available to you if you are working and on a low income. Additional Needs Payments are available for:

- essential repairs to property, including motor vehicles and replacing household appliances and furniture.
- the increased cost of fuel and electricity
- assistance with deposits for private rented accommodation
- furniture, bedding and other items if you are setting up a home for the first time
 - funeral costs
- recurring travel expenses such as for hospital appointments or visiting relative in hospital or prison
- food, clothing or shelter in the aftermath of a fire, flood or other emergency event
- other additional exceptional needs as they happen

Additional Needs Payments are paid under the Supplementary Welfare Allowance Scheme and is administered by the Community Welfare Service (CWS) of the Department of Social Protection. Application is made on form SWA1.

Rent Supplement

Rent Supplement is a means-tested payment for certain people living in private rented accommodation who cannot provide for the cost of their accommodation from their own resources. It is a short-term income support for people in the private rented sector. This supplement is administered by the Community Welfare Service.

Housing Assistance Payment

The Housing Assistance Payment (HAP) is a form of social housing support for people who have a long-term housing need. HAP is available in all local authority areas and will eventually replace long-term Rent Supplement. The scheme is administered by the local authorities, who pay the landlords directly. The rent being charged for the accommodation must be within the limits for the household

type in that local authority's area. Tenants pay a weekly HAP rent contribution to the local authority, based on their income and ability to pay. Under the HAP scheme you can take up full-time employment and keep your housing support. This payment is administered by Cavan County Council.

■ **MABS—Money Advice & Budgeting**

MABS is the Irish money advice service. They have been helping people to deal with problem debt for 30 years. If you're struggling with debt and need help, we're here for you. HEALTH

■ Health Service Executive

The HSE provides a range of Health and Social Services for Older People including: Medical Cards, E111 Cards, Drugs Payment Scheme, Long Term Illness Scheme, Hardship Allowance, Chiropody, Adult Optical and Appliances, etc.

■ Public Health Nurse

Public Health Nurses in Ireland are employed by the HSE to provide a range of health care services in the community. They are usually based in the Local Health Centre and may be your first contact with the health services. The public health nurse provides home and clinic nursing care to persons over 65 years who have a medical card.

Services include post hospital care, dressings, injections, referral to respite and day care and assessment for Nursing Home Subvention, home support, nursing aids and appliances. Your Public Health Nurse will also advise you on Dietary, Diabetic and Counselling Services.

A list of Public Health Centres in County Cavan can be found in the appendices of this guide.

■ Medical Card Scheme

The Medical Card Scheme entitles certain people to free public health services. To be eligible, your income must be below a certain level. If you do not qualify for a card on income grounds you may get a GP Visit Card. There are different guidelines for the means test depending on whether you are under or over 70

years of age. In the case of a couple, the assessment is based on the age of the older person.

■ **GP Visit Card for Over 70s**

Everyone aged 70 or over and ordinarily resident in Ireland is eligible for free GP care, regardless of income. Medical Card holders and GP Visit Card holders do not have to register for this scheme. If you do not have one of these cards you can apply online at www.hse.ie. You can also contact the HSE info line (listed on the previous page) or your Local Citizens Information Centre to find out more.

■ **Treatment Benefit Scheme**

The Dept. of Social Protection provides limited dental, optical and aural services under the Treatment Benefit Scheme. This Scheme is available to insured workers and retired people who have the required number of PRSI contributions. ■ **The Dental Treatment Services Scheme**

This Scheme (DTSS) provides access to limited dental treatment for adult medical card holders (only) and does cover GP Visit Cardholders. This includes a free oral examination every calendar year and free emergency dental treatment to relieve pain.

■ **Long Term Illness Scheme**

Drugs and medicines for the treatment of a particular range of conditions are free of charge. Check with your Public Health Nurse or

ask at your Local Citizens Information Centre for the list of Long-Term Illnesses covered by this Scheme.

■ Home Care Package

This Scheme is operated by the HSE. It aims to help people who need medium to high care support to continue to live at home independently.

It is tailored to individual needs and may include services of nurses, home helps, physiotherapy and occupational therapy.

■ Respite Care

Respite Care is a service provided within the residential units whereby older people receive care for a period of 1 or 2 weeks to give their main carer / family a well-earned break. This service is provided in 2 residential units in Cavan:-

1. The Sullivan Centre provides respite care for those who have a diagnosis of Dementia.
2. Virginia Community Health Centre

Cavan has 3 public residential care units. These units provide long term care, respite care and palliative care to older people from the area. Below is a list of residential units in the county.

- Virginia Community Services
- Sullivan Centre - this centre care for those with a diagnosis of dementia
- Breffni Care Centre, Ballyconnell

Lisdarn Transitional Unit is situated on the grounds of Cavan General Hospital, which has 32 Beds and provides 24hr nursing care for those who no longer require acute nursing care.

The ICPOP Hub Cavan is also situated adjacent to Lisdarn Centre.

■ **Respite Care Grant (Carer's Support Grant)**

Persons in receipt of Carer's Allowance, Carer's Benefit, and/or Prescribed Relative's Allowance automatically receive the Respite Care Grant from the Department of Social Protection. This is paid once a year usually on the first Thursday in June. For more information or to get an application form you can contact your Local Social Welfare Office or your Local Citizens Information Centre.

■ **Nursing Home Information**

The Nursing Home Support Scheme known as the 'Fair Deal' provides financial support to people who need long term nursing home care. Under this scheme, you will contribute towards the cost of your care and the State will pay the balance. This applies whether the nursing home is public, private or voluntary. The HSE administers the Fair Deal Scheme with the resources available. Applicants cannot avail of State Funding for a nursing home place prior to receiving approval of their application. Your Public Health Nurse can supply you with the nursing home list and application forms.

■ **Day Centres for Older People**

Day centres are places where Older People come together locally to combat loneliness, to have a chat and do activities such as exercises, arts & crafts, painting, computers, play cards, bingo, listen to music and sometimes dance. Older People are warmly welcomed and are treated to a cuppa and home bake, and a 3-course lunch. A list of Day Centres in Cavan is available in the appendices of this guide where you can find details of who to contact in order to attend your local Centre.

■ **Cavan General Hospital**

Cavan General Hospital is an acute general and maternity Hospital, which forms an integral part of the Health Service Executive Northeast Region. The Hospital aims to deliver a patient-centred, quality-driven focused service and provides a wide range of diagnostic and support services for Co. Cavan. Tel: 049 43 76000.

■ **Occupational Therapy**

These services are provided to people who through illness or disability are in need of support or change to their lifestyle. Occupational Therapists can advise on changes that may be needed in the home to support a person with special needs and on activities that will help a person to regain their independence. Referral to the Community Occupational Therapy Service is done through your local Public Health Nurse.

■ **Assist Ireland**

The website www.assistireland.ie contains information on daily living aids, mobility aids and assistive technology. It includes a directory of products available from suppliers for people with disabilities and older people.

■ **Chiropody Services**

This is provided by the HSE for free to Medical Card holders over sixty five. Application forms and information on services available can be obtained at your Local Health Centre or Citizen's Information Centre.

■ **GP Out of Hours Service — NEDOC (North East Doctor on Call)**

This is a service to provide you and your family with access to urgent family doctor services outside of normal surgery hours. Access to the service is by

appointment only, by contacting 1850 777 911. NEDOC is not a walk-in service.

■ Mental Health Services in Co. Cavan

Mental health problems are common and can range from a low period to more serious depression, to a small number of people who will experience very severe issues. If you feel persistently sad, have trouble sleeping or experience unexplained aches and pains, you should visit your GP for advice. If you are worried about yourself or someone you know it is important to get help as soon as possible. There are several options:

- Contact your local GP. If it's late in the evening or night-time, contact NEDOC.
- Go to the Emergency Department at your nearest hospital, Cavan General Hospital or Monaghan General Hospital. Contact emergency services on 999 or 112.
- Call the Samaritans, the 24-hour listening service, to talk to someone about what's on your mind. Call 116 123.
- Contact the HSE Mental Health Administrator for Cavan on 049 43 78920
- GROW is a voluntary organisation that provides friendship and support for people with mental health problems and people who are at risk of mental health problems. Contact number 1890 474 474

HOUSING

■ Cavan County Council Housing Department

Cavan County Council's Housing Department provides confidential support services for older people and people with disabilities who are in need of housing or who need to improve the accessibility of their homes. The level of grant aid available under each scheme shall be determined on the basis of gross household income and the improved costs of the works as assessed by Cavan County Council. ■ Housing Aids for Older People Grant Scheme

The Scheme of Housing Aids for Older People is available to assist older people living in poor housing conditions to have necessary repairs or improvements carried out.

The types of works grant-aided under the Scheme include reroofing, re-wiring and the provision of central heating (where none exists) or is broken beyond economical repair.

Applicants should be 66 years of age (or over). The maximum grant available is €8,000.

■ Housing Adaptation Grant for People with a Disability

This scheme is available to assist in the carrying out of works that are reasonably necessary for the purposes of rendering a house more suitable for the accommodation of a person with a disability who is a member of the household. Works grant aided under the Scheme include; a ramp, grab rails, level

access shower, a stairlift, an extension (typically for a bedroom and /or bathroom to accommodate a person with a disability). The maximum grant available is €30,000

HOME SERVICE SUPPORTS & MAINTENANCE

■ Better Energy Warmer Homes Scheme

This scheme aims to improve the energy efficiency and warmth of homes owned by people on low income. It is operated by the Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI) and is available nationwide. The service involves the **installation** of standard energy efficiency measures appropriate to the eligible household subject to SEAI survey, budget allocation and available capacity. The service is provided at no cost to the household and the measures currently available under this scheme are: Attic insulation, draught proofing, lagging jackets, energy-efficient bulbs, cavity wall insulation and energy advice.

■ Better Energy Homes Scheme

The **Better Energy Homes Scheme** provides **grants** to homeowners to improve energy efficiency in their homes. This scheme is different to that listed previously as it provides grants to improve energy efficiency rather than installation. Grants are available for the following energy saving work:

Roof insulation

Wall insulation - for example, cavity wall, internal dry lining or external insulation Heating controls upgrade

Installation of a high-efficiency boiler (more than 90% efficiency) including a heating controls upgrade

A Building Energy Rating (BER) after the energy-saving work is carried out (you must get this BER to qualify for the grant) Solar heating

SAFETY & SECURITY

■ Emergencies

At some point in your life, you may need to call the emergency services such as firemen, police, or medical personnel. By being prepared for calling the emergency services, you can get the help you need much more quickly which can often make a

In Ireland we have two emergency numbers, **999** and **112**.

112 also works in all EU countries and from any phone, free of charge.

Remember when calling **112** (or **999**), 'stay calm, stay focused and stay on the line'.

■ The Seniors Alert Scheme

The Seniors Alert Scheme is run by Pobal and provides grant support for the supply of equipment (e.g. Personal Pendant Alarms*) to enable older people without sufficient means to continue to live securely in their homes. The grant assistance is made available through community and voluntary groups registered with Pobal. To be eligible you must be:

- Aged 65 or over and have limited means or resources
- Living alone or with someone who also meets the eligibility criteria

- Living in the area covered by the community group administering the grant support
- Able to benefit from the equipment being supplied
- Willing to maintain contact with the community group

*A Personal Pendant Alarm is a pendant worn at all times which, when activated in cases of emergency, provides immediate contact with persons appointed by the pendant alarm user to call emergency services.

■ **Crime Prevention Officer**

Crime Prevention Officers (CPOs) are trained to encourage, promote and advise on crime prevention to both the private and business community. There are dedicated Crime Prevention Officers within each Garda Division. The Crime Prevention Officer for the Cavan/Monaghan Garda Division is being recruited at present. Further details will be circulated when confirmed.

■ **Community Engagement Unit**

Cavan/Monaghan Community Engagement Unit came into being in May 2021 and saw the introduction of four dedicated Community Engagement Units in County Cavan and County Monaghan covering each of the four Garda Districts in the Garda Division. This new unit provides an enhanced service to the communities in Cavan and Monaghan and all four units engage with their respective communities in many different ways:

- Promote and develop on initiatives such as the Schools Programme, Hospital Watch, Business Watch, Neighbourhood Watch and Community Alert.
- Engage with the elderly and vulnerable and also offer support and guidance to Families who find themselves in difficult circumstances.
- Regular community patrols have been conducted providing reassurance and support to the public.

- Visit local retirement homes and will develop new community initiatives as part of their role.

■ TFI Local Link Cavan Monaghan

TFI Local Link Cavan Monaghan, one of the 15 national Transport Coordination Unit's, has responsibility for managing the provision of Rural Transport on behalf of the National Transport Authority (NTA) in the Cavan and Monaghan Area.

Door to Door Services

Door to Door routes are bus services that operate a pick-up and drop-off at the door service, for people living in rural areas. These services have provision for wheelchair passengers and are demand responsive, that is they require you to pre-book by calling 047 51840. Single adult fare is €3, return is €5.50 & Free Travel Passes are accepted.

Regular Rural Service

These daily bus services operate to a scheduled timetable, stopping at bus stops along a fixed route between towns & villages. Currently Local link operate seven daily services across Cavan and Monaghan. Cavan services are listed below.

C1 – Cavan Town Route - operates 7 days a week.

■ Free Travel Scheme

Everyone aged 66 and over living permanently in the State is entitled to the Free Travel Scheme. Some people under 66 also qualify. If you qualify for free travel, you are issued with a card that you must carry with you when using public transport. In some cases, a Free Travel Companion Card is available which allows a person to travel with the holder (if they are unable to travel alone).

Free travel is available on all State public transport with some exceptions and is also available on certain private bus and ferry services. You may also travel free of charge on certain cross-border services between Ireland and Northern Ireland. Private bus transport operators that have opted in to the Free Travel Scheme accept free travel cards. Contact SITT to check if your private bus operator accepts free travel cards.

■ Free Travel and Public Services Card

The Government is introducing a Public Services Card which will allow people to access a range of government services and payments. The Public Services Card will eventually replace the Free Travel Pass. If

you are entitled to free travel, when you are issued with your new Public Services Card it will also be your Free Travel Card. The card will have F-T printed in a yellow octagon in the top-left-hand corner of the card. You must show your Public Services Card to the travel operator when you are using public transport you are aged 66 or over and are getting a social welfare pension, the Free Travel Card will issue automatically if you have registered for your Public Services Card. If you have not registered for a Public Services Card, you will be asked to register before your Free Travel Card issues to you.

■ **All Ireland Free Travel Scheme**

This scheme allows a Free Travel cardholder to travel free of charge on all bus and rail services within Northern Ireland using a Senior Smartpass card. Free Travel cardholders wishing to avail of the All Ireland Free Travel scheme within Northern Ireland must first get a Senior SmartPass card. To get this you must fill in an application form. (It is **not possible to get this form online**, you must contact your social welfare local office). From June 2016 "Active and Healthy Ageing, Falls Prevention and Awareness clinics" will be operating from each of the Community Hospitals in the county. These clinics will be a central point of referral for Older People who have had or are at risk of falls.

Any Older Person attending the clinic will undergo a comprehensive falls risk assessment which will include assessment of their fall history, medical history and general health, balance and mobility, vision, bone health, education on falls prevention and other tests as required. Following assessment at the clinic onward referral may be made to other health care professionals for appropriate interventions in order to prevent and reduce the risk of falling.
